The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN L. QUIGLEY, at New Orleans on December 2, 1963:

Lieutenant FRANCIS L. MARTELLO, Platoon Commander, First District, New Orleans Police Department, informed that on August 10, 1963, he interviewed LEE HARVEY OSWALD at the First District Police Department after his arrest in New Orleans for distributing Fair Play for Cuba Committee literature.

During interrogation of OSWALD, Lt. MARTELLO stated he obtained from OSWALD's wallet, a piece of paper which contained handwriting and handprinting in Russian and English. One of the items appearing on this piece of paper in English was the notation "MA PAA", followed by the numbers "33853."

Mr. PARHAM RAYMOND, Supervisor, Pan American Airways System (PAA), 709 Common Street, advised that the initials "MA PAA" meant nothing to him. Further, that the initials "MA" did not designate any Pan American flights. He could not suggest what these initials stood for.

Mr. RAYMOND further advised that the number "33853", which could possibly be a telephone number, was not the number for the New Orleans Office of PAA.

A review was made of the directory of all district sales offices of PAA, for the US, Europe, Pacific, and Latin America, which included the telephone numbers for the various sales offices, as well as the home telephone number of the ranking official of each office. There was no such number as 33853 recorded.

MARINA OSWALD was interviewed at 11611 Farrar Street.

A Verifax copy of a page of notes handwritten in partly Russian and partly English, original of which had been found in the wallet of LEE HARVEY OSWALD at New Orleans, Louisiana, by the Police Department at the time of his arrest on August 9, 1963, was examined and discussed with MARINA OSWALD. The writing on this piece of paper is fragmentary and much of it is not understandable. The following notes are what can be made out by Mrs. OSWALD.
