The paper says the George Piazza who died in the plane crash has a sister, Marguerite Piazza who is a relatively wellknown opera singer in the NO area. Must all be a frightful coincidence.

A Texas Magazine has asked me to review Roberts' The Truth About the Assassination. This book should be burned, but I have reviewed it and will send you a copy of my article, whether it is printed or not.
