Reference is made to various communications, the most recent being my letter dated April 24, 1964, concerning Mrs. Shirley Martin also known as Mrs. Mark E. Martin of Hominy, Oklahoma.

Enclosed for your information are two copies of a self-explanatory communication from our Dallas Office dated April 24, 1964, relating to information furnished by Mrs. Jean Lollie Hill. This communication concerns a telephone call Mrs. Hill reportedly received from an unidentified woman in Oklahoma on April 22, 1964.

From the information contained in the enclosed communication and from prior experience with Mrs. Martin, it is possible she is the unidentified caller.

For your information, Mrs. Hill was interviewed by this Bureau on November 22, 1963, the results of which were submitted to you and appear on page 35 of the report of Special Agent Robert P. Gemberling at Dallas, Texas, dated November 30, 1963. Mrs. Hill was reinterviewed on March 13, 1964, and the results were furnished to you with my letter dated April 2, 1964.

This is being furnished in view of your prior interest in Mrs. Martin and no further action is being taken.

On the evening of 4/22/64, Mrs. JEAN LOLLIS HILL, 9402 Bluffcreek, telephone EV 1-7419, telephonically contacted SA CHARLES T. BROWN, Jr., at which time Mrs. HILL stated she and Mrs. MARY ANN MOORMAN, who had previously made photographs of President KENNEDY available to SA BROWN, were together and Mrs. HILL desired to furnish the following information:

Mrs. HILL stated on the afternoon of 4/22/64 she was contacted telephonically by long distance by an unidentified woman in Oklahoma who questioned her regarding her knowledge of the assassination of President KENNEDY in Dallas. Mrs. HILL stated she did not know who the woman was and she advised the woman she did not wish to discuss the matter. Mrs. HILL said the woman persisted in her questioning and made reference to the fact that she was either furnishing information to MARK LANE, an attorney in New York, or MARK LANE was interested in information she was obtaining. Mrs. HILL said she also believed the woman made some reference to the fact that their interview was being recorded. Mrs. HILL said the woman was very persistent in asking questions about her knowledge of the assassination and Mrs. HILL was very persistent in refusing to answer. The woman finally closed the conversation by making a statement to the effect that she was only trying to be friendly with Mrs. HILL because she may later need a friend.
