Dear Mac,

There is only one thing that will encourage me more than your "I want to get together as soon as possible" note at the bottom of your letter of yesterday. That is the time your heavy schedule permits it.

While ordinarily I would hesitate to suggest an intrusion into your scanty out-of-the-office time, I think it would be much better if we could talk without other things being on your mind, for in the phrase of the younger people, I'll blow it enough. Alas, much too much.

It would be better if you could come here. We know each other well enough so I know you would take my word. However, I do not want it to rest there. I want to put what I have in your hand, and if you have questions, I want to put the answers in the form of documentary evidence in your hand, too. I can. As an alternative, I'd drive down almost any evening you are free, carrying a bit with me. I can't begin to take what you might want to see. There is now so much and you will have only a little time, I think it would be better to pursue what you want rather than what I might think you'll find most significant.
