In some ways the pressures against this book are even greater. Perhaps a live accused has something to do with that.

The publishers do nothing, say nothing, make no explanations, and everyone else I know thinks they have been reached. Fine is a less paranoid view, they now fear what might happen to anything else they may publish.

The distinction is without meaning. They have not arranged a single promotion and have tried to discourage the few friends and I have worked on.

Meanwhile, despite the "fairness" doctrine, every major talk show that has aired the other side has refused this one, the only voice on this side, which I do believe is the lone voice on this issue speaking for a decent society and the upholding of the lows.

Unless one has means, the doctrine can have no meaning and that freedom is for those who do have means.

There is no point in pressing them, but so you'll know how much attention the Army pays to you and to the law, I am still waiting to hear from them, after all these months. Were I not so weary, with so much more to do than I can begin to, I think I'd go into district court and file a complaint.
