Having just seen your comment on WTOP-TV news, I write this hasty note.

The "big gun" the administration produced for the preventive-detention bill is central in my successful suit against Justice.

He is Chief Magistrate Frank Milton, of London's Bow Street Magistrate's Court. Milton's beliefs about rights, freedoms and legalities is reflected by the fact that he surrendered the original records of the James Earl Ray Extradition hearing, keeping no copies.

There remains no official court record in Britain, thanks to Milton.

Is this the voice Congress would heed?

And who lied to me about all this, who denied he had the records when he had both the court set of original and the Justice Departments set, they having originated this evidence in the form of affidavits?
