I do not have any extra sets of those House committee reports. I have been informed that 12 volumes of the King report have been printed, with vol. 13 still to be printed; five volumes of the Kennedy report have been printed, with volumes 6 through 12 still to be printed; one volume of the Legislative & Administrative Reform Report has been printed, with one volume still to be printed; and the one volume Final Report is still to be printed. Perhaps you were able to acquire some of these in the past. If so, let me know which ones you are missing, although prospects for acquisition are not bright, inasmuch as the committee has been dis-established.
