In proof he told him that he

of anti-Cas insurgents, stabbed
by a Castro guerrilla. His autopsy
revealed that he had a
12-15-inch scar. The DA's
Office has photos of scar
— frequently seen in Office of Benavides

⑧ - Guy Bannister:

a close associate of many yrs says he was deeply involved in anti-comm. activities & was the liaison man for numerous Latin-America revolutionary movements working w/ a U.S. Intelligence Organization -

" Guy partook in every rev. wing, South & Central Amer. revolution that came along while he had the ofc. In Lafayette st.

— munitions were seen in his ofc on several occasions early in 61

⑨ frangible bullet - outlawed by Geneva, manufactured almost exclusively by the Italian and ~~European~~ U.S. govt's disintegrates on impact, making a large wound, leaving no projectile of any size

DA's ofc has bullets to fit Italian rifle found in TSB D

(10) Oswald - DA's JFC believe
O's notebook contains obviously
wired telephone no's, other
enciphered mat'l, together
w/ ~~some~~ references to micro-dot
film. Oswald trained at Atsugi
AFB in Japan, a known CIA
training ground.

(11) Why was Kennedy killed?

- after Bay Pigs, it was made
w/ CIA because of the
disaster; yet CIA continued
to operate here in late 61 +
early 62, & in the training
of Cubans for additional insurgent
activities against Castro.

2 separate commando groups
being trained in NO area in
early 63, one covert, one overt.

eventually ~~covert~~ group moved
back to Miami. Other disappears

On July 31, 1963 The FBI
seized a ton of munitions near
where one of the groups had

been found in St. Tammany
100 lb bomb casings, powder,
primer wad, percussion caps &
other explosives

This was considered by fervent
anti-Castro Cubans to be a final
disavowal of their activities
and their anger was aroused.
Earlier -

In October, 1962, ~~anti~~ anti-Castro
Cuban sentiments were aroused by
what they considered K's failure
to follow up on the Cuban missile
crisis by retaking the Castro-dominated
Carib. Isle.

While Oswald was reportedly fired
from his job at the The Ruby
Coffee Co., block away, July 19
1963, Marina Oswald told the
Warren Commis he "lost" his
job" in Aug.

Again, it was July 31 that the
famous, notorious cache
from Philly, was raided by
The FBI.

Even after the overt
Cuban training camp departed,
Oswald reportedly continued
his ass'n w/ Dache-Castro
Cubans, & was seen frequently
in the company of a Cuban
described as powerfully
built.

(12) Gordon novel, a fug. witness,
has said that he, Arcacha,
Ferrer, Shaw & other figures
in the Garrison invest, all worked
for the CIA, altho he has denied
~~that~~ publicly being a CIA agent.
novel has upheld the story to
friends & associates & it has been
confirmed by sources close to
him & by mounting circumstantial
evidence.

(13) Oswald was known to have passed
out pro-Castro leaflets at ITM
at the same time that a militant
anti-Castro group led by Ferrer
was demonstrating close by.

His role is pictured in the Garrison
invest. as that of an undercover
agent provocateur - who aided the
anti-Castro movement by providing

to palpable evidence of real activity. He was a revolutionary looking for a revolution - any revolution.
