Fire at Perch Of JFK Killer To Be Probed

DALLAS, Aug. 5, — A county grand jury will investigate a fire that two weeks ago raged through the Texas Schoolbook Depository, perch of John F. Kennedy's assassin, a Dallas justice of the peace said today.

The blaze destroyed three floors of the building from which Lee Harvey Oswald shot Mr. Kennedy in November, 1963.

Justice of the Peace Robert Cole has referred the case to the grand jury after a preliminary hearing for a building employee, Winfred Jack Anderson, to determine whether Anderson should be charged with arson.

Anderson, 25, was arrested July 28 by Dallas fire marshals and charged with setting fire to the historic building. He is free on a \$1,000 bond.

Anderson was employed as building manager by Nashville, Tenn., entrepreneur Aubrey Mayhew, who had planned to convert the infamous structure into a museum of Kennedy memorabilia.

Capt. B. V. Gulley, a fire department investigator, testified that several five-gallon gasoline containers were found on the ground floor of the vacant building after the fire.
