

**Texas Book Depository
Reverts to Original Owner**

DALLAS, Aug. 2 (UPI)—The Texas School Book Depository reverted to its original owner yesterday when the Republic National Bank foreclosed on a Nashville businessman who had planned to turn the historic building into a Kennedy museum.

D. Harold Byrd, who sold the building to Aubrey Mayhew in 1970 for \$650,000, was the only bidder at the foreclosure sale on the steps of the Dallas County Courthouse. His bid was \$471,958.77, which he said was the amount Mr. Mayhew still owed him.

Mr. Byrd said he planned to resell the building from which Lee Harvey Oswald assassinated President Kennedy on Nov. 22, 1963.

Mr. Byrd said he was working on a sale transaction totaling \$1.1-million.

**Man Held for Arson
At Oswald Firing Site**

Dallas — (AP) — An employe of the man who owns the old Texas School Book Depository building has been charged with arson in connection with a July 20 fire at the site from which President John F. Kennedy was shot in the back in 1963.

Winfred Jack Anderson, 25, was arraigned before Judge Robert G. Cole, who set bond at \$10,000. Anderson remained in Dallas County jail, apparently unable to make bond.
