I have so many items to send to you, I don't know where to begin. Enclosed with this letter you will find several good, clear photographs of Saul. These were taken by Bob Smith at the Archives and we have the negatives. Therefore, depending on what the publisher wants, we can supply glossies, of any size, etc., desired. Also enclosed are a couple of slides of interest.

You will note that I have enclosed some material on what we consider as "satellite murders." Some of these materials are very persuasive, and, I believe, demonstrate the ruthlessness of those behind the plot. It is my own personal opinion that a well-written chapter on the subject is both relevant and desirable for the book. I can write such a chapter but do not wish to spend the time on it until a decision is made by you and Jim that it would be included in the book.

Rather than send a number of loose photographs for use by your artist, I am sending a copy of Josiah Thompson's book Six Seconds in Dallas. The fly leaf has an excellent aerial photograph of the Dealey Plaza, and the book is filled with photographs which would help an artist. I am also sending several magazines with photos.

At the moment, we do not have a really good copy of the Zapruder frame 313 where the President's head is being blown apart. However, we are getting one for you. Along with Six

Robert Sherrill, in my view, is a very responsible and respected writer and should be quoted at some length. I would be very circumspect about quoting from the other books, but they are all certainly relevant and should be digested.

I have written the chapter on the history of Saul's picture. Bob Smith is adding a few footnotes and I will air-mail it in the next couple of days.
