FROGMORE, SOUTH CAROLINA 29920 REQUEST FOR INFORMATION CONCERNING JAMES EARL RAY, CONVICTED ASSASSIN OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING

Enclosed is one copy each of a self-explanatory letter received in the second from captioned individual dated August 14, 1970, and my reply to him.

It is noted that McMillan is a free-lance writer who appeared in the office of Mr. Thomas E. Bishop, Assistant Director of the FBI Crime Records Division, on June 4, 1968. He requested information concerning. James Earl Ray for a book he was writing about the latter, and he was informed that no assistance could be given him since investigation of Ray was continuing.

Our files also disclose that McMillan was the author of an article entitled "The Birmingham Church Bombing," which appeared in "The Saturday Evening Post" issue of June 6, 1964, and that he also authored another article, 'Racial Violence and Law Enforcement," which was published in pamphlet form by the Southern Regional Council, which has allegedly been affiliated with the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, an organization cited as subversive by the House Committee on Un-American Activities (now known as the House Committee on Internal Security). On several occasions during the past few years, McMillan has contacted several FBI Field Offices for information in connection with articles he was writing concerning civil rights matters. No cooperation has been extended to him by the FBI in the past

While I do not believe it would yet be appropriate to make public the contents of the Ray files, a certain portion of the file has already been made available, in connection with a civil suit brought under the Public. Information Act by Harold Weisberg, to Mr. Weisberg and thereafter to other individuals. Those papers consist only of the original documents filed on behalf of the States of Tennessee and Missouri in the extradition proceedings in the British Court. It is our intention to make these papers available in the future to authors, publishers or members of the public who wish to inspect them and who make appropriate arrangements through this Division.
