I read this article in the
Boston Sunday Herald Advertiser.
Here are a few dates and names etc.
that you may be interested as regards
Pres. Kennedy's murder in Dallas, Texas.

I went to work in Dec. 1961 for
Mertyn, Inc.

Job site: Watertown Arsenal
Watertown, Mass.

It was a U.S. Gov't base.

- 2) In January of 1962 material started to arrive on our job which was made in a non-union shop. It was a direct violation of our contract.
- 3) The material was also in violation of the specifications of the U.S. Gov't contract. I blew the whistle on it.
- 4) In May 1962 I declared for the office of business manager of my union. A couple of days later sabotage was committed in the area I was working.
- 5) I volunteered for a lie test. But I was (in effect) told I was guilty and that lie test was not necessary. John Forquites the chief security officer said this.

- 6) It was rumored that Vice-Johnson was involved in how the Martyn Co. of Dallas, Tex. got that contract.
- 7) U.S. Gov't agents came after me. They destroyed my name and reputation in my union and before my neighbors. They sent agents surreptitiously into my home and to my wife about information about me.
- 8) I was fired in June 1962. I didn't realize it at the time but agents were working on my wife mentally, emotionally and psychologically. This went on for months. It's a long story.
- 9) We separated in March, 1963

- 10) In April of 1963 I went to the Boston Office of the F.B.I. and pleaded for a lie test. They did not know what I was talking about. But they tell me it was probably the military people who were after me. BUT the F.B.I. said they had jurisdiction in the case.
- 11) I waited for a few weeks to go by then I called the chief security officer John Foguites at the Watertown Arsenal. I asked who conducted that investigation against me and my wife. (Actually it was a sheer reign of psychological terror.) He told me, "The U. S. Army."
- 12) In June of 1963 I got a chance to go back on that job. The Mortyn Co. of Texas had been removed. As far as I am concerned they milked the contract besides not doing the job

according to specifications.

Arden Engineering Co., Inc. of
Cast Prov, Rhode Island had
taken over. The contract was
for over a million dollars.

13) I called up the F.B.I. and told
them to cover. I didn't know
what the hell was going on.
I was now caught between the F.B.I.
and (I believe) military intelligence.
The next several months were
nerve wracking for me. (It is also
a very long detailed story.)

14) On Nov. 16, 1963 I quit the
job. Most of my work was done
except for a few odds and ends.
That was for Arden Eng Co. But my
nerves were shot. Pres. Kennedy was
murdered the following week.

15) It is still my opinion that had that case broken when I quit that job and Vice. Pres Johnson was involved the Kennedy never would have gone to Dallas the next week.

That case was never publicly broken. I was later forced to call J. Edgar Hoover over a bar. I believe Hoover and his top aides covered up for Lyndon Johnson. I think that is possible Johnson was involved in tipping off bids to Texas ^{on govt contracts} ~~from~~ all over this country.

16) Personally from all I've read or heard I believe that Oswald alone killed Kennedy. But I also believe he got there first! It is possible Kennedy was being set up by the commies.

However, I believe that from all that I was involved in at the time that Kennedy was being set up for murder by the extreme right wing elements of the C.F.A. and military intelligence who have had a continuous working plan to seize and over throw the U.S. Govt.

Seven Days in May? I think it can be seven minutes any time at all. -
