### Sylvia Orenstein Meagher

Bureau files revealed Sylvia Orenstein Meagher was investigated during the early 1950's under Loyalty of Employees of the United Nations and Other Public International Organizations r IR, (136-2214), while employed by the 'orld Health Organization. By letter dated 8/27/54, the Civil Service Commission advised a favorable loyalty determination was forwarded to the World Health Organization concerning her. Bureau files also reveal Meagher was a participant of a European tour sponsored by the "Mational Guardian," to depart New York City on 7/22/64. The New York Office conducted an appropriate inquiry concerning this matter and subsequently closed its case. It is noted the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" published by the Conmittee on Un-American Activities cites the "National Guardian."

Bureau files contain a letter which appeared in the "Mashington Post," 6/12/66 under "Letters to Editor" column signed by Sylvia Meagher. She stated in essence that the inconsistencies which appeared in the Marren Report are real. Also on 7/27/65 Sylvia Meagher telephonically contacted the Laboratory indicating she was preparing a book on the assassination of President Kennedy, and she raised questions concerning the procedures followed in the examination of the "Zapruder" film (amateur film taken depicting the assassination event). No comment was made to Miss Meagher concerning this matter, and she was tactfully referred to the Marren Commission Report. 

#### RECOULTENDATION J:

This index will be evailable to numerous individuals interested in the Marren Commission Acport. Since this index was prepared under a series of subject classifications and subdivisions which apparently extend beyond those publiched in the Marren Commission Report, it is believed it would be beneficial for future reference.
