Dear Mr. Gelber:

Mr. Richard E. Gerstein has referred me to you. I had asked him for copies of the tape recording or transcript of the conversation between an informant of the Miami Police Department and a representative of the National States Rights Party, whom I take to have been Joseph Adams Milteer, made in Miami November 9, 1963.

My purposes in making this request are these: I have written, probably more extensively than anyone else, on the assassination of President Kennedy and have gone into this. I am continuing my investigations and writing, and this evidence now assumes a potential importance it may not earlier have had. I have developed other evidence I believe to have been unknown previously. I expect all of my files, ultimately, to be part of an archive at a major university and I would like them to be as complete as possible.

If there is anything you can provide me that you would prefer not be published, if you will so indicate, I will respect your wish. And if there is additional information to which you can direct me, I will appreciate it.

Of the men involved, at the moment, my greatest interest is in Milteer and Jack H. Brown.

As I told Mr. Gerstein, if any of my work is of any interest to you, I will regard it as a privilege to help.

Thank you for anything you can do.
