EX-AIDE IN PENTAGON WARNS OF MILITARY

WASHINGTON, March 28

(AP)—The Pentagon's former research chief called on Congress today to halt the growth of the United States military machine before it becomes a Frankenstein monster that could destroy us.

Herbert York, director of defense research and development during the Eisenhower administration, urged Congress to question military witnesses much more closely and to insist that the Pentagon build a wall of defense against the

uncontrolled growth of the military machine.

He said a group of experts will discuss the two-day conference on Capitol Hill by 17 Senators and 18 Representatives. The conference will discuss military spending and the need for control.

The conference will discuss with the experts will help them determine an effective course of action to enlarge the role of Congress in setting military policy.
