

U.S. General Belittles Korean Red Threats

PANMUNJOM, Korea (UPI) — U.S. Army Maj. Gen. Richard G. Cicciola of the United Nations Command (UNC) declared Saturday that despite North Korean threats the Command "has a good chance of winning the war." He said the Communists were "not going to continue showing the movie 'we don't want to have a war' here with you and me."

North Korean delegates angrily walked out of a Korean Armistice Commission meeting when a film was shown of President Johnson's visit to Seoul last November.

The movie was shown at the 24th meeting of the commission because the Communists had charged repeatedly the U.S. was the "enemy of the Korean people."

The North Korean chief dele-

gate, Maj. Gen. Chung Huk, shouted at the UNC delegation led by Cicciola "this is not a movie scene."

"If you're going to continue showing the movie 'we don't want to have a war' here with you and me," he said, "the Communists are going to continue at this truce village. Some of Pak's aides made insulting remarks to Cicciola as they walked away."

The North Korean Foreign Ministry said in a statement the situation along the demilitarized zone had reached "an unbearable, grave stage."

UNC officials called the meeting to protest recent Communist intrusions across the demilitarized zone (DMZ) border between North and South Korea.
