In the middle of making the enclosed xeroxes of the pictures what I should have thought of to begin with finally came to mind! So Much too late!

You can get copies of the pictures free!

Each person, under the 1992 Act, gets the first 100 pages of xeroxing free or as I understand it the first \$100 in pictures, tapes, etc.

I can't get them free because I've asked someone to use that credit to get me several transcripts.

This means, in all, each individual member of your family can, and so can Charles.

That part of the National archives has moved to a new building on the campus of the University of Maryland at College Park, MD. I do not know the zip code. I believe the man in charge is named Steve Tilley. It is the special JFK assassination archive. And it is separate from the university.

The Altgens picture is similar to but not identical with CE 203. It is a version with a number I do not recall that is wider than exhibit 203. It may have been cropped to make 203. The version I used shows more on its right.

There may be a question raised about getting a picture copy of Page 19, volume 19, Exhibit 885. That is because of the Zapruder copyright. If they decline that I think that if Hal Verb is asked he'll find someone who can make a picture of that page of the book. That would be clearer than my sending you that page. If not he can perhaps have it done commercially and I'll repay him. Any printer who prints by offset had a camera that would be fine for that. That camera can remove the photo-engraver's dots.

What you would ask for that may not excite them about the copyright is a copy of the pictures that were used to make page 19 of Volume 19. Those are filed ~~XXXX~~ separately, with what was sent to the printing office.

If I remember correctly after all these years, the version of the ~~Z~~ Altgens picture I used on pages 202-3 is as it was published in the Saturday Evening Post. The Commission used that article.
