### POWERFUL NEW DRIVE TO DISARM AMERICA

Last month we exposed a new plot to disarm America which was started at a "Symposium" held at the University of Michigan last December. This meeting was attended by nearly 400 "prominent" citizens, educators, clergymen, government officials and businessmen.

We also demonstrated how these people are using facilities paid for by your taxes to propagandize for both national and civilian disarmament. We also gave information about the communist affiliations of several of the speakers. In the following paragraphs we include additional information about the speakers at this symposium. On the following pages we give the names and addresses of about half of the persons that attended. In our next issue we will complete the list along with further information about the communist and pro-communist affiliations of more of these individuals.

Edward A. Conway - director of the Creighton University Center for Peace Research and also on the board of directors of the communist-leaning "War/Peace Report".

Harold Lasswell - as a member of the Communist Party (Hearings of the House Committee on Un-American Activities) Lasswell taught at the Chicago Communist School and has a long history as sponsor for various communist fronts and activities such as the Chicago Repertoire Group and the Chicago Workers Theater.

Karl Wolfgang Deutsch - born in Czechoslovakia. Took part in the organization of the United Nations at San Francisco in 1945. Was chief of research section of the highly communist-infiltrated OSS. Worked for US Department of State in 1944-46 but did not become even a naturalized citizen of the United States till 1948.

Seymore Melman - a member of the national advisory council of the ultra left-wing Student Peace Union and associate of identified communists. He is author of a book "The Peace Race", the sale of which is promoted by Fellowship Publications. He was speaker at the Second Annual Conference of Scientists for Survival and he recently appeared before the House Appropriations Subcommittee urging major cuts in US defense spending. His opinions are frequently quoted in literature of the Friends Committee on National Legislation.

William Belcher Ballis - has worked in several official and unofficial government positions as an "expert" on the Soviet Union. He is a member of the Detroit Committee on Foreign Relations and an honorary member of the Institute for Study of the USSR. In 1960 he was a delegate to the Sino-American Conference on Intellectual Cooperation.

**SECOND.** Learn your friends and your enemies. After you have studied the above material to the point that you are sure of your facts you can convince others, begin carefully to feel out people, trust, but unfortunately, you may be surprised to find that some of the people you know for years are either so left-wing in their thinking or so brain-washed that they will be antagonistic to you or anyone else that tries to tell them the truth.

There will be others, however, that may already realize what is happening or whom you can convince of the truth. Organize a small group of friends that have confidence in each other as a study group; first to inform themselves of the true situation and then to find means of mutual protection if and when the communist take-over occurs. Do not overlook the use of women in your band. They are likely to be suspected and therefore can be very valuable as spies, couriers, etc.

**Keep your activities secret!** Perhaps you think that this warning is unnecessary but we have seen too often what will happen to individual citizens that are critical of our government or who become effective in their fight against communist subversion. If it should become known that you are a real patriot, you may find that you will lose your job over it. If you are in business, you may be boycotted or you may suddenly find it impossible to obtain materials or bank credit that you need to continue business. If you become too outspoken you may find yourself suddenly placed in an insane asylum without any trial or legal defense. If this seems impossible, then let us assure you that we know of many cases where it has actually happened.

**THIRD.** Buy and hide away all the guns, ammunition, food, medical supplies, clothing and other essential materials that your band can possibly afford. Investigate the gun laws in the state where you live and the surrounding states. Try to buy your guns under circumstances where they will not be registered in your name. Many good sources of guns and ammo at the best prices can be obtained by subscribing to the Shotgun News, \$2.00 per year (single copy, 25¢), Box 57, Columbus, Nebraska. A good source of information on gun laws and use of firearms is Gun and Ammo Magazine, \$2.00 per year, 9999 Hollywood Blvd., Los Angeles 26, California.

**FOURTH.** Study the tactics and strategy of underground warfare. Your own life, the lives of your family and the freedom of Americans for generations to come may depend on your willingness to do this. The following books may be obtained as source material:

**FIFTH.** Plan ahead as to what you can do in the case of either a violent or non-violent communist take-over. The average person would assume that the United States troops would be on the side of freedom but this cannot be depended upon. The traitors within our country are continuously working to move patriotic army officers out of key positions and put their own stooges in command. Soldiers obey discipline and it would be a mistake to think that they would desert a communist-ruled government to save themselves. Remember that a communist government will not allow the general population to know that you and your friends are really patriotic Americans. You will be pictured as Fascists or common criminals. Although the big majority of FBI Agents are loyal patriots they are an investigative organization only and are under the command of the Attorney General, Robert Kennedy. These are some of the things that you must consider while improvising the best you can for secret hideouts, means of communications and travel.

**SIXTH.** Plan to work entirely on your own. Keep the identity of your band secret from everyone else. Large anti-communist organizations such as the Rangers, the Minutemen, the Citizens' Armies, etc., cannot possibly maintain the absolute security which will be vital to the organization. Your friends obtain literature from one of these organizations that can be helpful to you. Remember, you cannot be too careful in choosing your associates. Two or three men who can work together in mutual trust can accomplish more in an underground movement than a group of fifty if the larger group contains even one member that talks too much, may turn up drunk when he is badly needed or who will chicken out when the going gets rough.
