7 Convicted Of Plotting to Rob 4 Banks

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP), --Seven men were convicted Saturday night of compiring to rob four suburban Seattle banks in a bizatre plot described as a training exercise for the secret Minuteman organization

The seven were arrested Jan. 26, on which they allegedly were to blow up police and power stations in Redmond as a diversionary factic before robbing three banks in Redmond and one in nearby Des Molnes. Still being hunted on the same conspiracy charges are Robert Bolivar De Pugh, 44, founder and head of the Minuteman organization, and Walter Patrick Peyson, 24, both of Norborne, Mo. An FBI informant who inflitrated the group told the jury the robberies were: to raise nearly \$100,000 for the Minuteman group.
