Sentenced ... For Raid

—A Superior Court Judge has given five Minutemen who pleaded guilty to staging a predawn raid on a Pacifist camp last August sentences ranging from one to 10 years. **Judge Douglass Wright said yesterday the men engaged in "misguided acts of pseudo-patriotism."

If a nonviolent dissenter such

If a nonviolent dissenter such as Dr. Benjamin Spock can be sentenced to two years in prison for aliegedly counseling young men to resist the draft, said Wright, the prison sentences were justified for the violent be-

were justified for the violent behavior of the Minutemen.

A Minutement blinded by gunfire during the raid Louis Rogers 23, of Lisbon, received the lignest sentence, one year in jail.

Four raiders in all were wounded in the predays shootout Aug 24 with state police at the farm in Volutown owned by New England Committee for Non-Violent Action:
