New Job Due for Mitchell?

WASHINGTON.

ATTORNEY General John Mitchell may be stepping out of the government fairly soon — possibly early next year.

Insiders say Mitchell is now committed to take over command of President Nixon's 1972 re-election campaign and that he plans to start the job by next spring.

The administration is intent upon divorcing the Justice Department from politics and this is why Mitchell probably will leave his post before assuming direction of the campaign.

He was the chief strategist in Nixon's 1968 victory.

A highly successful bond lawyer on Wall Street before entering the government, Mitchell is understood to be interested in getting back to his lucrative stamping grounds.

But should Mr. Nixon win another term, Mitchell could wind up in Washington again in his role as one of the President's closest advisers.
