Mollenhoff Can See Any Tax Return

Presidential aide Clark Mollenhoff has access to any citizen's federal income tax return on a "need-to-know" basis, the Internal Revenue Service said yesterday.

A spokesman said the returns are make available in response to written requests from Mollenhoff is his capacity as special counsel to the President under Section 6103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. That section of law says that tax returns shall be open to inspection "on the order of the President" and under rules approved by him.

The law also grants authority to view tax returns under certain conditions to the tax-writing committees of Congress, state taxing authorities and other federal agencies.

Under presidential order, the Senate Government Operations and Judiciary Committees and the House committees on government operations, public works, internal security and crime have been grated permission to inspect returns under certain conditions

Mollenhoff, a former Washington investigative reporter, i
has been acting as a presidential "trouble-shooter" investigating present and past misdeeds involving federal agencies and officials. An administration source said earlier this
week that Mollenhoff is able
to secure anyone's tax return
and internal files anywhere in
the federal government simply
by requesting the information.
