When your letter and copy of article arrived, I read the letter and because I might not have had time to read the article promptly put your letter aside to answer as soon as I could. But I didn't have time. Now I've read the article and can't find the letter.

I think it is a basic flaw to quote the liar and self-server Haldeman and that this will not be accepted by most people, including editors.

I think also that you make a claim that will not be credited, at the very beginning, that "There is conclusive evidence that the assassination . . . was a conspiracy engaged in and covered up by high agencies of the United States Government." Covered up, without question. Engaged in, no real evidence.

There is more, like some factual errors, but I write in haste not to keep forgetting and to suggest that you rethink this as a statement of opinion or belief, without claim to what does not exist, like evidence of a government conspiracy to kill, and then, using much of the very good material you've drawn together, you have a better chance of publication.
