The author of this book was a contract employee of the Central Intelligence Agency in the late fifties and early sixties. For "The Company," and acting on orders from its highest echelons, he flew into Cuba on the day of the Bay of Pigs invasion to monitor mysterious transmissions that proved the existence of Soviet missiles poised in Cuba - one year before President Kennedy publicly admitted their presence.

For the CIA, he counterfeited Cuban currency - and was arrested by the Secret Service on direct orders from then Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy.



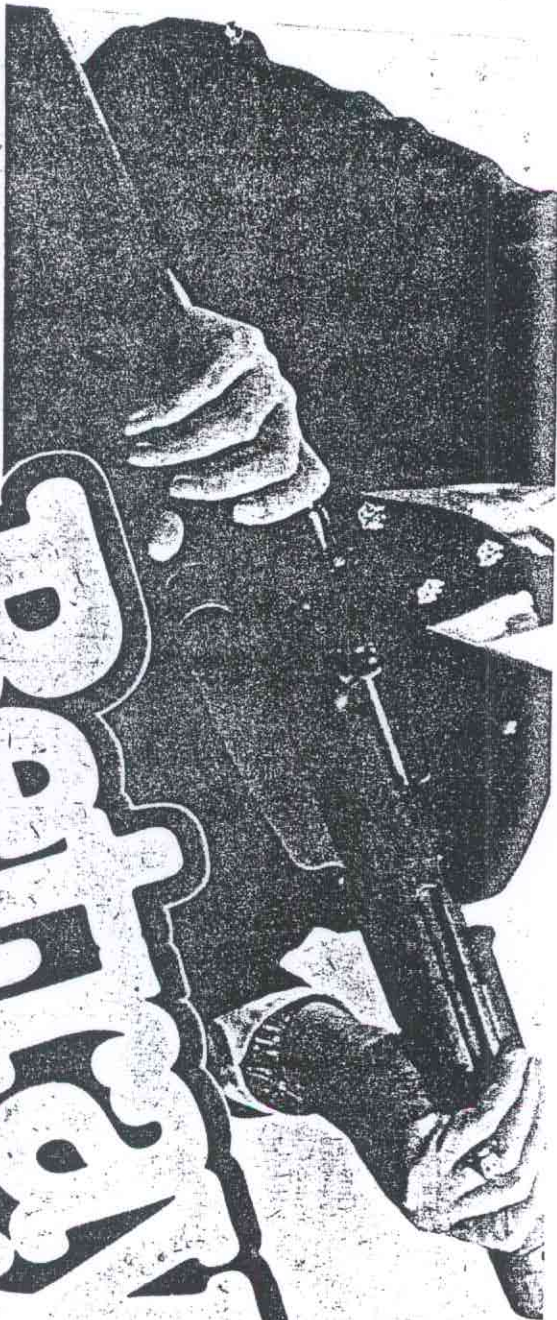

For his superiors, he traveled with one Dave Ferrrie to Athens to purchase large quantities of weapons for uses neither the president of the United States nor his secretary of defense knew anything about. Involved in effecting their transaction was a Dallas nightclub operator named Jack Ruby. For "The Company," the author went to Paris to pick up a package being forwarded from Russia by an American agent - named Lee Harvey Oswald.

He was present when the deputy director of the CIA called John F. Kennedy "a traitor." He once read a memo from then Vice-President Lyndon Johnson to the deputy director, warning the latter of John Kennedy's intention to undermine the CIA's effectiveness. One day his case officer, without further explanation, ordered him to purchase three Mannlicher rifles. Shortly afterward, President Kennedy was assassinated.
