Fateful vehicle: The limousine that carried John F. Kennedy when he was fatally shot in Dallas is not lost in the mists of history. It's on display at the Henry Ford Museum & Greenfield Village in Dearborn, Mich., about 15 minutes west of Detroit. After the president's death on Nov. 22, 1963, the 1961 Lincoln Continental was rebuilt with titanium armor, bulletproof glass and a permanent hard top. One of five presidential limos on display, the JFK car is one of the most viewed and photographed artifacts in the museum, staff reports. The facility is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily except Thanksgiving and Christmas. For Information:

Symposium/tour: History-America Tours will host a five-day symposium and tour in Dallas beginning April 12 dedicated to better understanding the death of John F. Kennedy. Historian guide Conover Hunt, who directed the effort to create the Sixth Floor Museum and preserve Dealey Plaza, will lead the event. Local touring will be led by researcher Dave Perry and will consist of following the route of JFK's motorcade from Love Field through Dealey Plaza to Parkland Hospital. The tour will follow accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald's escape route, the site where Officer J.D. Tippit was killed, all known Oswald sites in Oak Cliff and conclude in the basement where the group will meet retired detective Jim Leavelle to whom Oswald was handcuffed when shot there by Jack Ruby. The symposium will involve an Interview with Buell Wesley Frazier, who drove Oswald to work on Nov. 22 and a talk by former Dallas Morning News reporter Hugh Aynesworth, who witnessed the assassination and covered the Tippit murder and Oswald arrest.
