

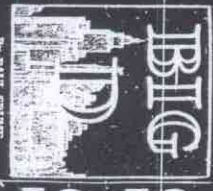

Love Field Braces for Thousands

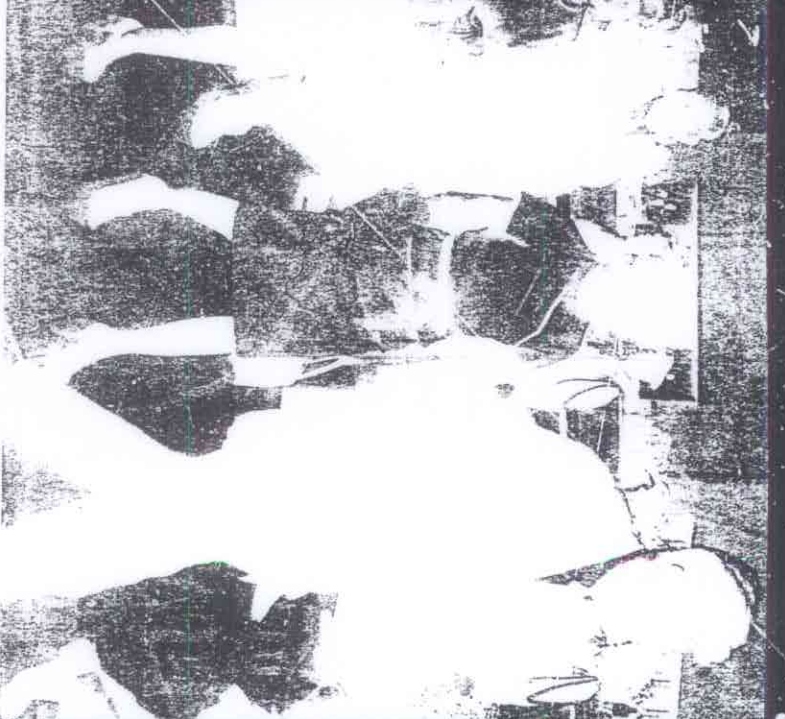

Split State Party Continues Feuds

Houston, Texas—President Kennedy wound up a day of "nonpolitical" campaigning in the Lone Star State Thursday night with almost a hurricane of political controversy swirling about him.

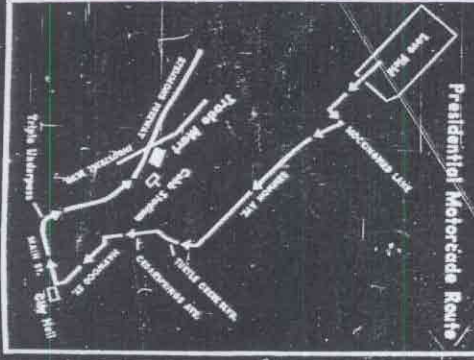
