A short reply to yours of the 23rd/3. I have been a little busy as of late as my wife Carol and I are expecting our first child in about a months time so thing have been a little hectic. I am glad that you had a fruitful trip to New Orleans. I gather from newspaper clippings that Dulles was to answer his subpoena in New Orleans today. Please keep me posted as to what happens in this regard if you have time.

Thenks for the copy of the Thayer Waldo letter. I really do appreciate little bits of info like this. I try to save all I can find in the papers up here in Canada, but generally speaking it doesn't usually amount to a great deal. Not that Mr. Garrison doesn't have a friendly press up here, but it certaintly isn't covered as well as in the U.S., especially in the New Orleans papers themselves.

I really do mean Willis Slide 13 in my arrest exhibit. I obtained this info from Dick Sprague in his Exhibt 1, Edition 2, of Dec./67. In this Dick lists the contents of 18 Willis slides, not just the 12 that Willis sells to researchers. I guess Dick had a chance to view these other 6 on one of his trips to Dallas, and from his description slide 13 shows the arrest of an individual outside the Dal-Tex building.

I'm glad you understand about the Davies incident, but it does bother me a bit. I have finally found a friend who is willing to work with me on this Similas affair. Will tell you more about this in the future.

Sorry about the Governor General slip. I did mean the Attorngy Generals Order of Oct. 31st/66. I do not have a copy of this Order so if you could find time to make me one it would be appreciated.

I too wrote the Archives on documents relating to Similas and I will send you a copy of the reply as soon as I get it.
