# ASKING GRAND JURY TO CALL KOHN--DA

Reacts to MCC Request for Counter Probe

District Attorney Jim Garrison's reaction to a Metropolitan Crime Commission call for a state investigation of his assassination probe methods was to announce that he will have MCC managing director Aaron Kohn called before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.

Garrison said in a news conference in his office Thursday that he will request the foreman of the jury to call Kohn for the next meeting, which will be Wednesday.

Earlier Thursday the MCC called upon Louisiana Attorney General Jack P. F. Gremillion to launch an exhaustive investigation into the manner in which Garrison is conducting his probe of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

An eight-page letter to the attorney general asked him to select a blue-ribbon committee to name a special panel of three investigators.

The letter was signed by Kohn and MCC president E. C. Upton Jr., and cited an hour-long National Broadcasting Co. program questioning Garrison's case. It said in part:

"If accusations broadcast throughout the nation on Monday night are true, the people of New Orleans are without basis for confidence that the laws of this state will be applied so as to convict the guilty and exonerate the innocent.

## 'NOW IMPERATIVE'

"On the contrary, there is reason for fear that anyone may be charged and prosecuted based upon contriving false evidence.

"We believe we express the opinion of all objective observers when we state it is now imperative that an official, impartial, fact-finding procedure be established to immediately and exhaustively examine all allegations made against the Orleans Parish district attorney's office."

Garrison replied to the call for the impartial fact-finding body by stating:
