GARRISON'S 'PLOT' CASE TOTTERS

NEW YORK, Tuesday.

THE New Orleans "conspiracy to kill Kennedy" investigation was left tottering today by a series of revelations about the methods of its chief investigator, Mr. Jim Garrison, the District Attorney, and his staff.

In any State other than Louisiana, they would have amounted to a death blow, but the signs today were that Mr. Garrison will fight back.

A National Broadcasting Company television programme claimed last night that witnesses lied at the preliminary hearing of the case against Clay Shaw, who awaits trial for conspiracy.

Two potential witnesses were said to have been offered bribes by the district attorney's office if they gave evidence against Shaw.
