AFFIDAVIT

if I, Richard C. Nagell, being first sworn, depose and say:
In September 1963, the exact date of which I am capable of verifying. I dispatched a letter via registered mail addressed to "Mr. John E, Hoover, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice, Washington 25, D. C." The envelope in which this letter was enclosed bore the same address, in
$\checkmark$ addition to the return address "Joseph/dramer, Aldo. Postal 88-Bis,

- Mexico, D. F., Mexico," and was mailed within the United States. The letter was neatly typewritten and composed in the style and format used by operational personnel of the Central Intelligence Agency in writing their reports; that is, it was clear and concise. $\therefore$ with the names of persons and organizations typed in caps.

In the aforesaid letter, I advised Fr . Hoover of a conspiracy (although I did not use the word "conspiracy") involving Lee Harvey Oswald "to murder the Chief Executive of the United States.
$\therefore$ (President) John F. Kennedy." I indicated that the attempt would h ib take place "during the latter part of September (1963). probably on the 26 th, 27 th, 28 th or $29 t h$, "presumably at Washington, D. C. I furnished a complete and accurate physical description of Mr. Oswald, listing his true name, two of his aliases, his residence address and - other pertinent facts about him. I disclosed sufficient data about the conspiracy (citing an overt act which constituted a violation - of federal law) to warrant an immediate investigation if not the arrest of Mr. Oswald. I revealed something about myself which

- incriminated me on another matter. I stated "by the time you receive this letter. I shall have departed the USA for good." I - signed the letter with the name "Joseph Kramer," an alias of a known - Communist (Soviet) agent then residing in Canada, and also an alias that I had used during my meetings with two FBI agents in January 1963 at Miami, Florida, who in turn used the name "The Tacos 7446 I am willing to under En a polygraph examination relative to any $^{\circ}$ and all statements made herein. 7.
