Bretty much the same is true of whatever I may have said about any Ted Kennedy candidacy, especially if I suggested he would not be a candidate out of his or his family's fear of assassination. This could be taken as an incitation. There are people who really are nuts. I do not say such things in public for reasons of this nature.

Private correspondence is a different matter. And you give no indication of what I said or to what I responded.

Elsewhere in my book I have used excerpts from two letters that you wrote to me in 1974, one dealing with Jones's tendency toward paranola and the other concerning Ted Kennedy's candidacy for national office. (Correction: the letter concerning Kennedy was from 1972.)

Let me say that I am amazed at the scope and continuity of your work. Surely you are encouraged by the re-opening of the investigation in the Congress--a breakthrough that could not have occurred but for your unremitting work.
