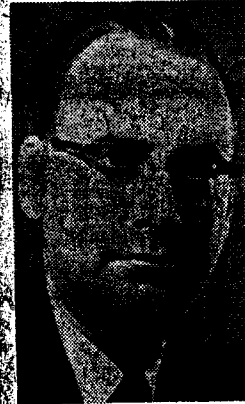
New Archivist Of U.S. Named

James B. Rhoads, 39, who received a Ph.D. in history from American University three years ago, was named archivist of the United States yesterday by General Services Administrator Lawson B. Knott Jr.

A native of Iowa, Rhoads has been with GSA since 1962 and had served as deputy to Archivist Robert H. Bahmer since 1966. Bahmer retired in March.

A contributor of articles to archival and historical publications, Rhoads lives with his wife and three children in Lanham, Md. His undergraduate studies were at Southwestern Junior College in Keene, Tex.; Union College at Lincoln, Neb.; and the University of California at Berkeley.

He is a fellow of the Society of American Archivists and a member of the American Historical Association and the Organization of American Historians.
