In the past I have protested that certain of the files of the Warren Commission have been withheld improperly, in violation of law and regulation. In every case, the National Archives has rejected or ignored these claims. To the best of my recollection, my protest that, with his death, the slight excuse that might have existed for the suppression (for this, in a ctual fact, is what much of the withhelding amounts to) of those files relating to the late David William Ferrie no longer existed has been ignored.

I herewith renew my request with respect to one of these Perrie documents, CD75:301. Before agreeing with your subordinates, I encourage you to read this document yourself. It cannot properly be withheld under any of the guidelines. Thereafter, I hope you will see fit to read the entire Ferrie file. Such documents can not longer be suppressed merely on whim or in the belief that proper access to them will embarrass the government - or on rew power alone.

HERMAN KOHLIAM, Assistant District Attorney, Parish of Orleans, sivised that he is familiar with David FERRIE from his past experience as a news reporter. KOHLIAM said he prepared a feature story on FERRIE'S activities several years ago. He advised that he heard that FERRIE was mentioned in connection with being associated with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and he talked to JACK MARTIM, a private investigator who "refreshed his memory" about Ferrie. Based upon these facts, the District Attorney's office instituted an investigation involving FERRIE. He advised that FERRIE was interviewed by members of the District Attorney's staff and denied knowing LEE Harvey OSWALD or having any information about OSWALD's being in the Civilian Air Patrol.

KORINAN stated that the District Attorney's office had received information from the Intelligence unit of the New Orleans unit Police Department who had previously conducted inquiries regarding FLYRID's connection or Cuban activities. An unknown police officer had told toe intelligence Division of the New Orleans Police Department that he was in the Civil Air Patrol site New Yorkeld and that FLYRID case Of ALD.
