Thank you for your informative letter of July 6 and the effort of your staff to obtain the information contained in it.

It is clear to me, as I hope it is to other researchers, that you are handicapped by restrictions placed upon you. I regret this, but I am confident none of your staff have imposed any restraints it is not incumbent upon them to impose.

My Johnson yesterday informed me of these two additional films and told me they will be shown me. I shall view them as soon as a time is mutually convenient.

If the exhibit or exhibits employing Frame 210 of the Zapruder film are not available for examination in the search rooms, I should like to arrange for the making of an 8x10 glossy print of this part of that exhibit only. This can be charged to my account.

It is some embarrassment to me to seem to put you and your staff in the middle in this matter. I want to assure you again that this is not my intention, for I have no doubt whatsoever that you are making available what you can make available and that your people have always been as helpful and cooperative as one might desire.
