Dear Mr. Johnson,

I have already asked you for any documents relating to Guy Bonniester and his detective agencies and those related with him and if that you may be able to refer me to. In this connection there should be a document or documents reporting to Robert Rosen what one or more Cubans, possibly including Cuban agents, reported, including the names of those involved in such Cuban activities and affairs. I am particularly interested in this or anything like it.

Generally, I should like copies of any documents relating to any Cuban activities, in New Orleans, Dallas, Florida and elsewhere, unless their value is very excessive. In this event, would you please, if and when you may have such documents, phone me reverse. I am also interested in Sergio Arcechis Smith and of the Cuban groups, two with which he has been connected in particular, the Cuban Revolutionary Council and the Cuban Revolutionary Front and Force, in particular, including reports on these people and groups whether or not the result of interviews with their personnel, or them.

Also, Cuban training camps, all aspects, and those related to these camps, directly and indirectly.

Should any of these be classified, may I have a reference to them?
