Dear Dr. Bahmer:

In his letter of October 9, Acting Archivist Walter Robertson told me, "The following documents have been received" from the Secret Service: "(1) the originals of the papers relating to the autopsy of President Kennedy that comprise Commission Exhibit 397 and (2) one of the eight original copies of the typed autopsy report (Commission Exhibit 387)."

I now have copies of these two additions. In neither case do they match these descriptions.

Exhibit 397 must include the handwritten autopsy notes, some of which were made during the examination, and it does not.

The typed autopsy report should include a copy of the authorization for it, and it does not. It also appears to be a copy of a Xeroxed copy that I have rather than a Xeroxed copy of an original.

Unless there was an error in copying these files, the archive is still incomplete and evidence has been physically removed from official exhibits, apparently during the Commission's possession of its own files.

On the other hand, if you have found the missing items, I would like copies at your earliest convenience.
