Dear Mr. Johnson,

There were two documents missing from the Xeroxing you gave me today. These were from the box I went over last week, the Rankin files. They are a January 11, 1964 memorandum from Mr. Shaffer, a single page, and one of September 25, 1964, two pages, from Mr. Liebeler and Mr. Griffin.

I would appreciate it if you could have these copied for me to pick up next Tuesday when I am in.

The documents I went over were in poor condition, as though they had been 10th copies made with worn carbons. So I know the copies you supplied could not be very good. However, almost without exception, these are much too pale and illegible. I wonder if you could ask your Xeroxing room if there was something wrong with their machine the day they copied these. I know they can be made blacker, if not by Xerox, then by other photocopy machines. These, really, are terrible.

Because these documents for which I asked copies today are also, in some cases, less distinct than I could hope for, I would appreciate it if you would speak to them to see if they can give a little more care to reproducing them.
