This is in reply to your letter of August 26, 1968, concerning the records of the Warren Commission.

We are preparing copies of documents of which we are aware and of which you may not have copies, relating to the rumor that Lee Harvey Oswald was connected in some way with a Federal agency. We will make records of the Commission available to you in order that you can search for material relating to this subject. We are also preparing a copy of the agenda for the executive session of the Commission of January 27, 1964, and its attached exhibits for you.

The affidavit of Agent Howe referred to in the memorandum of Leon D. Herbert of February 24, 1964, is among other affidavits attached to the letters of February 12, 1964, a copy of which is being prepared for you. We do not know of any statement filed by or on behalf of Agent Kaack.
