Dear Mr. Johnson,

Yesterday I received the following Warren Commission documents:

CD 75: 232,474,674, 897; CD 301:13; CD 12, 1-3; CD 152+ 15; CD 302; 182; CD 59: 4-5; CD 34: 3-3; CD 1107: 473,1115; CD 385: 104-8; CD 205 (apparently)142. I also received identical copies of CD 34:3 from the same files of those mentioned in it.

In addition, I received these pages on which no file was indicated: S- Controls 103 (Bensinger) and 703 (Rice); the Key 5 affidavit of Jessie Garner; a Garner report on which I cannot tell whether it is CD 418:203 or CD 205:418. I would appreciate keeping the file identifications so I can mark these documents with their proper sources.

Perhaps there was no time to let me know whether there is in these files: the FBI report on its interview with James J. Elaine and possibly Dick White, for which I asked and which should be there because Elaine was interviewed; the FBI report of their August 1963 interview(s) with Charles Bringuier, referred to on page 60 of the typescript of his testimony; whether there is another or other reports of the August 1963 interview with Oswald, in New Orleans. I appreciate the copy of CD 12, the Kasch report of October 31, 1968, but this does not identify the other agent with Quigley on this occasion, as testified to by Bringuier, or whether he did file a report.

With respect to my earlier requests for access to the Kerrie material at least some of which I believe to be and to have been improperly classified, the subject of Mr. Angel's December 11, 1968 and other letters to me, I have been informed by Assistant Attorney General Nixon that this and other files are under current review. If and when these are declassified, I would like copies as soon as possible. If any other files are then declassified, I would like to know which as soon as you have the list.

Thank you for the speed with which you handled my yesterday's request.
