This is in reply to your letter of February 19, 1968, concerning the records of the Warren Commission.

We are sending you copies of the records you requested in your letter which we have been able to locate. No copy of the Boyle film or of frames from it are in the National Archives.

A Secret Service report relating to a conversation of an organizer for the States' Rights or National States' Rights Party "buzzed" or tape-recorded by the Miami Police Department that involved a threat of the assassination of President Kennedy, which you requested orally, has not been found among the records of the Commission. If you can give the Commission document number, Secret Service control number, or the name of the organizer, we shall be pleased to make a further search. We should also be glad to make numbered Commission documents and other records available to you in order that you can make a search for any records in which you are interested.
