Should there be any references of similar nature relating to the ONI or the DIA or any other intelligence agency, I would like them also.

May I again respectfully sell your stantion to the lack of response to my letter to Dr. Behmer regarding the release of the CSA-Kennedy family contract? I delieve I am entitled to a specific enswer and I would hope the National Archives does not believe otherwise.
