Dear Mr. Johnson,

Yesterday I received the following Bureau declassifying documents:

GD 75: 232,274,674, 697: 10 201:13; 10 13, 1-2; 10 100: 13; 10
208: 108; 10 50: 4-2; 10 34: 201: 1107; 273, 100; 10 100: 10-8; 10 200
(apparently)142. I also received identical copies of 10 34-2 from the mass files
of those mentioned in it.

In addition, I received these pages on which no file was indicated:
St. Controls 100 (Heneviday) and 703 (Nico); the day 5 affidavit of Jesse Garner;
a Garner report on which I cannot tell whether it is 10 415:208 or 10 206:113.
I would appreciate knowing the file identifications so I can mark these documents
with their proper sources.

Perhaps there was no time to let me know whether there is in these
files the FBI report on its interview with James J. Flaine and possibly Dick
White, for which I asked what which should be there because Flaine was interviewed
the FBI report of their August 1963 interview(s) with Carlos Bringuier, referred
to on page 20 of the typescript of his testimony; whether there is another or
other reports of the August 1963 interview with Oswald, in New Orleans. I appreciate
the copy of 10 13, the Hearst report of October 31, 1963, but this does not
identify the other agent with Quigley on this occasion, as testified to by
Bringuier, or whether he did file a report.

With respect to my earlier requests for access to the Ferris material
at least some of which I believe to be and to have been improperly classified, the
subject of Mr. Angel's December 11, 1968 and other letters to me, I have been
informed by Assistant Attorney General Tinsler that this and other files are
under current review. If and when these are declassified, I would like copies
as soon as possible. If any other files are then declassified, I would like to
know which as soon as you have the list.

Thank you for the speed with which you handled my yesterday's request.
