Dear Mr. Johnson,

Yesterday I received the following documents:
DD 75: 232,474,674, 697; 4-261:13; 4-14, 1-2; 40 1004 13; DD
808; 108; DD 80: 4-2; 47 341 547; 4-1107; 473,1107; 40 808; 104-8; DD 506
(apparently)142. I also received several copies of 40 34-8 from the same files
of those mentioned in it.

In addition, I received these pages on which no file no. indicated:
Sl. Controls 108 (Benavides); and 703 (Price); the day 8 affidavit of Jesse Garnett;
a Garnett report on which I cannot tell whether it is 40 418:208 or 40 208:418.
I would appreciate knowing the file identifications as I can match these documents
with their proper sources.

Perhaps there was no time to let me know whether there is in these
files: the FBI Report on its interview with James J. Elaine and possibly Dick
White, for which I asked as which should be there because Elaine was interviewed
the FBI report of their August 1968 interview(s) with James Bringuer, referred
to on page 50 of the typescript of his testimony; whether there is another or
other reports of the August 1968 interview with White, in New Orleans. I appre-
ciate the copy of 40 108, the Garnett report of October 31, 1968, but this does not
identify the other agent with Quigley on this occasion, as testified to by
Bringuer, or whether he did file a report.

With respect to my earlier requests for access to the Ferris material
at least some of which I believe to be and to have been improperly classified, the
subject of Mr. Angel's December 11, 1968 and other letters to me, I have been
informed by Assistant Attorney General Larson that this and other files are
under current review. If and when these are declassified, I would like copies
as soon as possible. If any other files are then declassified, I would like to
know which as soon as you have the list.

Thank you for the speed with which you handled my yesterday's request.
