This is in reply to your letter of October 6, 1968, concerning Lee Harvey Oswald's change of address cards.

We are preparing for you a copy of the side of Commission Exhibit 79<sup>4</sup> which does not appear in the published exhibit. As you may know, the original of this exhibit is the same card as the original of CE 793, which shows both sides of the card.

If you will send us a list of Oswald's change of address cards of which you want copies, specifying the Commission exhibit numbers or FBI numbers involved, when possible, we shall prepare copies for you. Please give volume and page references to the Hearings of the Commission where Wesley J. Liebeler alludes to a change of address card as having been mailed after Oswald left New Orleans.

It will help us to give you better service if you will provide specific citations or sources of information when you request copies; otherwise, our staff must repeat the research which you have already done.
