Mr. J. P. Quigley,

This is to ask you for those documents I have ordered and have not received and for answers to the unanswered inquiries I have made, including for a list of the references to David A. Ferrie and the reasons for which each of these withhold is withheld.

It has been rather a longer time than can be accounted for so normal delays from being bury.

I would also like copies of all documents, whether or not in the files of the Warren Commission, about Mr. Fred Melvin Coffey, Marvin Reschowef and Rayne Martens, all connected with Ferrie. If any of these are withheld, I would also like their identifications and the reasons in each case. By "from" I include statements made by others, whether or not signed by them.

The inordinate delays in responding to my requests are improper and are contrary to law. I do hope that whether or not you ordered it, you will take it into consideration with "freedom of information" and my rights to service in law demands and no simpler than that rendered others.
