Dear Dr. Rhoads,

In a number of ways I have acked for every available decument on the autopey of President Kennedy or in any way relating to it. I have been sesured that your agency has made everything not classified available to me.

The receipt of November 26, 1963, by Robert I. Bouck, covering autopsy-items received from Admiral Burkley, lists several items not given me. I would like them now. These see:

"One carbon copy of letter deted November 26 from Commanding Officer, U.S. Medical School (sid), concerning law and regulations regarding confidential usture of the events."

"One receipt deted Nov. 22, 1963, for bed sheet, surgicel drapes, and shroud used to cover the body in transit".

"One receit, deted Nov. 28, 1965, regarding a carten of photographic film, undeveloped except for X-rays, delivered to FRS for sefekeeping."

"An original and six pink copies of Certificate of Death (Nev. Med.N)"
"Authorization for post mortex exemination signed by the Attorney General"
and dated Nev. 28, 1965."

A copy of the original of the death certificate will suffice.

If any other items relevant to the entopsy have come to light or been transferred to the Archives since my requests. I would also appreciate copies of them.

If any receipts were given by of for Admiral Burkley, I would like them also, plouse. And if any other receipts, memorands, letters or notations of any kind in any way relating to or about the pictures and K-rays of the autopsy are in the Archives, I would like copies of them, too.
