Unfortunately, I've never had time to check carefully on those items on which I have pressed at the Archives. Often I later find out the efforts have succeeded. I had pressed Dr. Behmer on the second-hand character of his JFK erchive, on the absence of originals and the absence of any of the authentic netse, any that sould, for exemple, be used in a legal proceeding. I had also pressed him to demand such thing of the Secret Service, and I had also needled Rowley.

Lest week when Henry Lippens was here he showed me a strange copy of the body chart he had just gotten. I saked him how some of it came to be in ink? He said that was what was in ink in the original. As we discussed this, it turned out he had seen the original and said it could be examined only with Simons or Johnson present. He also we med to remember a note in the lower left-hand corner of this part of the exhibit. This, of course, could have been the Burkley note on the copy bearing his initialing that already had.

Inwas held up an hour yesterday in getting to see these things, max doubt because I phoned in advance and said exactly when I'd be there, from accress the etreet, in the DJ building.

They produced a large manils envelope marked in red crayon "Exhibit 597-Originals". Inside was the original copy of everything printed was Ex 507, but home of what was exhibit own notes during examination of the auxil body.

The most inmediate explanation is that the first copy was with a camera or or ying device (like Thermofex) incensitive to blue, for tiexerigization in unless, as I seem to recall, humas wrote in blue. Burkley initialed the original. But the printed and all thermony except the one xeroxed depies do not beer his initialing. Humas' corrections, as I recall, also were in blue. Indications are toney used a bell-point pen.

Reducing the margins might have been enough to eliminate Burkley's initialy, but there is one place he drews mavering line and he signed the last page, which else was lined (and masking it would have eliministed those lines only).

I did not want to except too interested in these originals, so I arranged to get color pictures made. This too time, but I wa sole to evolve something new, to reduce the cost, which otherwise would have been \$200. They are making me 35mm positive color slides. From these we can make color sopies and they will be alides. It will be about 10 days before they are done.

The humes notes, which are the same size as the pages of the proctotol in all copies, are on a much smaller piece of pad paper.

Separately there is a file of a covering letter by Rowley and receipts, of which I ordered xerox copies that could not be made yesterdey while I weited. The Rowley letter is deted in 1967, clearly after the transfers persuant to the Clerk executive order, as after my preseuring.

There are what seem to be diluted blood markings on the originals. My original opinion, recorded in WW, is that these were the "wotel fluids". Again, a these are solid markings. In the zerox copies they have but an outline, again suggesting either Thermofexing, which is insensitive to red, or similar photography. Original in this per, refers to body chart only. These markings ere on the face side only. On the reverse side is Minck's had chart, with the scheme at the bottom. Is published, the white space has been contracted. But no contraction or omission is recorded or suggested in the copying. This would also seem to date the linck sketches (see analysis in IM).

should be checked. I believe there is no reference to holograph, only axisissix typed copy, which Burkley slee initialed (it is not in this file). My suggestion is that Burkley's initialing of holograph was when it was completed, before it was typed, or, without ever saying anything bout it, humas took it with the other papers to him. The appended typed receipts are also Burkley initialed and approved.

it is conspiratorial. These seems to be no reason for anything but straight xeroxing, with exact duplication resulting, unless such things as eliminating Burkley's initialing and approval were intended. It will be necessary to make a close comparison of the corrections in the xeroxed copies and the pictures. In the original, there is heavy scratching ever, but speed between the scratches is visible.

after I have these pictures in my possession, I will seek to learn what else was then transferred by Rowley, here mu file of correspondence with him should be examined, because he says he gave the Archives everything. There is no separation of originals and copies, but he has failed to provide copies of the ampine things I have sought and he has told me he gave the transfer mano to the Archives, at least a greating the original in that case, if not his only copy.
