Doar Mr. Weisperm:

This is in reply to your letters of April 12, 13, and 13, 1970.

As we have previously informed you, we did not prepare a list of material relating to David W. Ferrie and did not furnish such a list to you. The file concerning Ferrie referred to in the New York Times story was not "pulled together" but was the portion of the "Other Individuals and Organization." File concerning Ferrie that was available for research. The request to the FBI to which you refer was an oral request that the FBI review those pages in Commission Document 75 concerning Ferrie that were withheld from research to determine whether any of them could be made available for research. We specific page numbers were mentioned. We were later teld orally that the Department of Justice had decided that none of the pages were to be released. There was no correspondence concerning the matter.

Emclosed are copies of meterial relating to Ferrie in Secret Service documents. The neme is suggestings spelled "Ferrie" or "Farry". Secret Service Control No. 620 in this material was among the material in the "Other Individuals and Organizations" file mate available to you in 1967 and at the time of your recent visit to the Estional Archives.

We are glad you are pleased with the photograph of the collet in Commission Exhibit 399 that we took for you. We did not prepare the photograph earlier because we did not receive the electrostatic copy or rough sketch of the photograph which we received you to send.

Copies of all papers in the file of staff minutes which you examined were sent to you. One memorandum dated January 15, 1964, concerning a conference is withheld from research under guideline 2.

We are enclosing copies of pages 321, 322, and 326 of the page proofs of the Warren Commission's Report. A handwritten dreft of the changes by Mr. Liebeler has not been found.

We note that we have not got the most the list of documents strikely from research concerning while we have to appeal to use important of Information of the Granus Terrors Combustration.
