

The copyright owners are listed with the films in Entry 18 of the inventory of the records. We regret that the information furnished in our letter of May 13, 1976, remarding <u>Them</u> 1(b) in Entry 18 of the inventory of the records was erroneous. We do not reproduce the film without permission from Station WDGU-TV (New Orleans). The cost of the film was also incorrect. The minimum order on motion pictures is \$24.00.
